Insurance Through the NSRMTA & CFMTA Explained

The insurance policy has to do with commercial liability – namely, that which is associated with having people within the home or on the property, while involved in activities associated with a business of teaching. Essentially, it concerns any bodily injury or property damage to a third party who is present for purposes of being taught, and for which the teacher might be deemed legally liable. It covers recitals and events elsewhere than the teacher's actual studio, so long as the teaching purpose is clear. It does not have to do with "while transporting the student in the teacher's car," as that would be covered by auto insurance, rather than home insurance. One's home insurance would not usually cover this specific sort of liability, except with the addition of a commercial liability rider costing significantly more than the \$25 NSRMTA/CFMTA insurance through Atkinson & Terry Insurance Brokers.
